

**Regular Meeting**

Algonquin, Ill.

April 3rd, 1890

This, the **first regular meeting of the Village Board of Trustees**, of the Village of Algonquin, was called to order by **President Peter**, in the **Modern Woodmen Hall**, with all the Trustees present.

It was decided that all transaction passed upon by the Board at all previous meetings be considered as legal.

At the meeting of March 27, the members of the Board were sworn into office in the regular form, by Town Clerk Ford, after which they drew lots for the long and short terms. with the following results:

Short term Trustees, in one year. John Johnston, Chas. Kublank and Wm A. Nason.

Long term Trustees, on two years. Andrew Doig Sr. D. W. Thomas and W. Seyk.

It was then moved and seconded that Geo. E. Smith be appointed Village Clerk until his succession be elected at the first regular election. Carried.

On motion, The president appointed a committee of three to prepare ordinances and to report at next meeting. The Following Trustees were appointed the

**Committee on Ordinances.** Nason, Johnston and Seyk.

The meeting of March 29, was called to order by the President and the following were:

Present: Trustees Seyk, Doig, Thomas, Kublank and Johnston.

Absent: Trustee Nason.

**The ordinances were next taken up, read and discussed and passed as presented by the committee with few alterations.** This occupied the attention of the Board the whole leaving and on motion adjourned to Thursday April, 3, 1890.

At this meeting all the trustees were present with the President presiding.

The question of Treasurer was brought up and names of James H. Philp was suggested. Upon motion he was unanimously chosen the Village Treasurer.

For **Superintendent of Streets** Ed Morton In was suggested and upon motion was as appointed.

For **Village Constable** Chas. Wandrack's name was proposed and on motion was appointed.

For the office of **Police Magistrate**, it was necessarily postponed until the next regular election, the Board of Trustees not having the authority to appoint.

The ordinances were next taken up and further discussed. Trustee Nason desired the **Ordinance on Gaming** to be reconsidered. It was so discussed without motion. Upon a vote being taken the ordinance was adopted as amended by a vote of 4 to 2, as follows:

**Ayes**, Nason, Johnston, Doig and Kublank.

**Nays**, Thomas and Seyk.

The ordinance on Licensed games and Peddler's license occupied the remainder of the evening and on motion of Trustee Thomas the Board adjourned to Saturday evening April 5th 1890 at 7:30 o'clock.

Upon a vote being taken the duties of the **Street Commissioner was embodied with the office of Police Constable and Pound Master.** and the President appointed **J.D. Keyes** as such officier.

The Committee on Ordinances reported as not having fully completed their duties but nearly so-

The Clerk was instructed to write to the publishers of the Sentinel and Plaindealer in regard to getting prices on ordinances to be printed in pamphlet form.

The President announced the following standing Committees:

**On Finances.** Trustees, Johnston, Seyk and Kublank

**On Streets, Alleys and Bridges and Sidewalks** Trustees Doig, Kublank, and Thomas.

**On Miscellaneous** Trustees Nason, Thomas and Seyk.

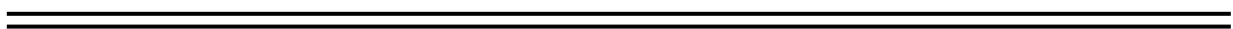

April 17th, 1890

The meeting was called to order in the usual manner by the president with all trustees present, except Trustee Thomas. On motion the minutes of the preceding meeting were approved as read.

The **Committee on Streets, Alleys and Sidewalks** reported as follows: that **all walks** on Main Street, between the railroad crossing and the North line of the plotted Village shall be "of good common 2 inch plank, 8 inches wide saved to an uniform length of 5 ft. 4 in. and laid upon 3 stringers of dimensions 2 X 6 inches the planks to be suitably nailed in a manner approved by the Street Committee - The above described walk shall also apply to both sides of Chicago Street from Main Street to the wagon road bridge crossing Fox River. All sidewalks not included in above specifications shall be of of good common 2 inch plank, 8 inches wide sawed to an uniform length of 4 ft., laid upon 3 stringers of dimensions 2 X 4 inches the planks to be nailed in manner approved by the Street Committee". Report adopted.

The **President revoked the appointment of the Police Constable to be Street Commissioner**, and on motion of Nason and seconded by Seyk, the Committee on Streets, Alleys and Sidewalks will attend to the duties of said office until further notice.

Moved to adjourn until Saturday evening Apr. 19th to read the Ordinances. They were adopted as read and on motion of Trustee Doig the Clerk was instructed to notify G. S. Southworth to publish 100 copies in pamphlet form at his price of One Dollar per page. Adjourned

Called to order by the President and all Trustees present. The minutes of the preceding meeting read and approved.

The resolution on street lamps and lighting of the streets was read and on motion was adopted. It is as follows:

"Resolved, that the Street Commissioner be ordered to see all persons owning or controlling all street lamps that are now in the streets of this village, and make arrangements to have them placed in his charge, and that he also report a suitable man to have charge of trimming, cleaning and lighting these lamps regularly."

On motion the bonds of Geo. E. Smith with John Johnston and Chas. Kublank as sureties, James H. Philp with James Philp and L. H. Wenholz as sureties, and John D. Keyes with Henry Keyes and Elmer A. Ford as sureties were approved.

A general talk on sidewalks was indulged in and on motion the committee on Streets, next meeting, the cost and estimates of construction a sidewalk form the south end of the creek bridge to the Hotel building.

The ordinance adopting or approving all others not having been prepared, there meeting adjourned until Wednesday evening April 30th 1890.

Called to order by the President with all Trustees present. The minutes of the preceding meeting read and approved.

On motion of Doig and seconded by Johnston, the bond of Thomas Kaban with Joachium Wienke and Waclav Mattas as sureties, was approved.

On motion of Doig and seconded by Kublank and Johnston, the bond of James Stehlik with Fred Diercks and W. Seyk as sureties was approved.

The **Committee on Streets, Alleys and Sidewalks** reported on the estimated cost of a **sidewalk** from the south end of the **creek bridge to the hotel at about \$115.00**, and on motion of Doig seconded by Seyk, the sidewalk was ordered build, provided, the Village Board furnish the material, Trustee Doig volunteered to construct the walk free of charge. Carried.

In regard to crosswalks, oak and pine planks were suggested, On motion of Kublank and seconded by Doig the Crosswalks shall be constructed out of 3 inch hard pine planks.

Section 2. of the Ordinance of "Licensed Games" was amended as follow: "provided any person holding a regular Saloon license shall be allowed to keep one billiard or pool table free of license, and for each **bowling alley Ten Dollars (\$10.00)** one year, and for all other tables not herein specified such sums as the Board of Trustees may direct." The amendment was adopted.

On motion of Thomas the Board adjourned until the first regular meeting Tuesday evening May 6th 1890.

The bond of James Stehlik could not be approved by the Board on account of one of the bondsmen not being a resident of McHenry County. The Clerk was instructed to notify Mr. Stehlik to procure another bondsman.

Sec. 2. of the Ordinances on "Shows and Exhibitions was discussed but no action taken.

On motion of Nason and seconded by Seyk, the **Committee on Streets and Sidewalks** was empowered to employ a surveyor to stake on **map out the Public Square of the Village** and report at the next regular meeting the results of such survey. Mr. John Briut of Crystal Lake was suggested as the surveyor.

The various nuisances committed in the village such as **slaughtering calves and swine, throwing ashes on the streets, shooting, and ???** were reported but no action taken further than to instruct the Constable to notify those person to desist in the slaughtering of animals within the corporate limits of the Village.

Nothing farther to discuss before the Board, the meeting adjourned, on motion, until Tuesday evening May 21st 1890.

Bills against the Village were next taken up, The of G. S. Southworth for printing ordinances was not approved on account of the commission of Trustee Doig's name. An amendment was offered, after the motion to accept the bill had been made, to the effect that if the mistake be rectified the bill should be paid. On motion of Nason and seconded by Kublank the bill was accepted and ordered paid as amended.

It was again thought advisable to appoint a Street Commissioner and one motion of Nason and seconded by Johnston, V.N. Ford was appointed as Street Commissioner.

The following bills were read by the Clerk, approved by the Board and ordered paid: approved by the Board and ordered paid: Frank Spitzer, attorney's fees on Village organization \$25.00; A. Doig's bill for Surveyor Brink's services in surveying the Public Square \$2.00; John Peter's bill for (Village) Seal \$6.00; Clerk's books, Blanks, R.R. Fare, \$5.00, & \$11.00; \$16.00.

On motion by Nason and seconded by Thomas, an appropriation of \$200.00 was made for the purpose of gravelling the streets.

On motion of Kublank and seconded by Seyk, a railing shall be placed on the south side of the street from the bridge as far as necessary on Chicago Street, safety of teams.

The Street Committee was ordered to report at next meeting, in regard to lamps, the telephone ordinance read and approved. Adjourned until Tuesday May 27th 1890.

Ford**, who had been appointed as Street Commissioner, **refused to accept the position**, and it was decided, for the present, to allow the Street Committee to continue to assume the duties of said office The Committee on Streets was notified that it was empowered to accept bids for contracts for grading and gravelling the streets of the Village without further instructions.

Moved to adjourn until next regular meeting.

The meeting called to order by the President with all members present. The minutes of the previous meeting not called for were not read.

The President then read some extracts from his law book which showed to the Board that certain actions taken on previous meetings were not according to law. The Trustees admitted their ignorance of the law and consoled themselves by having acted in good faith. This was principally in regard to the power given the Committee on Streets and on motion **John Helm was appointed as Superintendent of Streets**, Street Commissioner.

Some of the property owners were reported as having built their sidewalks to far out in the streets and it was thought advisable to instruct the Clerk to notify the County Surveyor to come there with his instruments and establish the street lines as soon as possible. It was so ordered.

On motion of Doig the **height of the sidewalk**, as built by Benthuisen on Chicago St. shall be the established grade for all walks on that side of the street from Johnsen's corner to Wandrack's house.

On motion the **grade on the south side of Chicago street**, from Fitzek's corner to Stehlik's be to the height of Wandrack's harness shop walk.

On motion the **grade on Main St. in front of F. Tomisky's property to be on a line from Mrs. Paub's walk to T. Kabon's old building walk.**

On motion the meeting adjourned to meet on Monday evening Aug. 25th.

The minutes of the two preceding meetings were read, the minutes of the first approved as read, while the clause relating to the height of the sidewalk on the south side of Chicago Street in the minutes of the last meeting, was made to read as follows:

On south side of Chicago St. from a point at J. Stehlik's level with C Wandrack's platform, on a straight line to Fitzek's sidewalk level on Chicago Street.

"F. Tomisky's sidewalk to be from Mrs. Pauba's line to the door-sill of T. Kabon's old building and Kabon's sidewalk on a water level passed his two buildings then on a gradual rise to the foot bridge walk."

"Mrs. B. Adamek's walk to be on a water level to the height of the center of the first step in front of the stove building occupied by Wenholz & Philp, and run south until it strikes the old sidewalk, and north on a level to a point in line with the N.E. Corner of the meat market, continuing from here on a gradual rise to the foot bridge walk."

Trustee Seyk wished to know whether the Congregational and Free Methodist Churches had been notified to build walks. When informed that they could not be forced to do so by law, he produced a letter giving an opinion bearing on the point, as given by Lawyer Cross, that the walks could be laid, the Clerk was instructed to notify the Trustees of said churches.

The bills for hauling dirt and gravel to be paid out of the \$ 200.00 approximation were read and it was found that there yet remained \$54.00 to expended. The total number of **loads of gravel hauled were 254, total number of loads of dirt 474, making a grand total of 728 loads @ 20 cents per load, on \$145.60**, the amount already expended out of the amount appointed. No action was taken, but the general talk and understanding was that the work commenced should be continued and completed as far as the remainder of the approximation would allow.

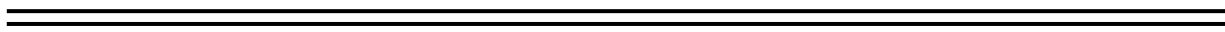
